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OPENING PRAYER: Made and Known by God, Psalm 139:1-18

Divide the group into a right and left side; instruct each side to read accordingly.

Right: LORD, you have probed me, you know me:

You know when I sit and stand;

You understand my thoughts from afar.

Left: You sift through my travels and my rest;

with all my ways you are familiar.

Right: Even before a word is on my tongue,

LORD, you know it all.

Left: Behind and before you encircle me

and rest your hand upon me.

Right: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me,

far too lofty for me to reach.

Left: Where can I go from your spirit?

From your presence, where can I flee? If I ascend to the heavens, you are there; if I lie down in Sheol, there you are.

Right: If I take the wings of dawn

and dwell beyond the sea,

Even there your hand guides me, Your right hand holds me fast. **Left:** If I say, "Surely darkness shall hide me,

and night shall be my light"—
Darkness is not dark for you,
and night shines as the day.
Darkness and light are but one.

Right: You formed my inmost being;

You knit me in my mother's womb.

I praise you, because I am wonderfully made;

wonderful are your works! My very self you know. **Left:** My bones are not hidden from you,

When I was being made in secret, fashioned in the depths of the earth.

Right: Your eyes saw me unformed;

in your book all are written down;

my days were shaped, before one came to be.

Left: How precious to me are your designs, O God;

how vast the sum of them! Were I to count them,

they would outnumber the sands;

when I complete them, still you are with me.





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SCAVENGER HUNT: Everyone's Contribution Counts

By adding up things that belong to each person in the group, participants see that each person's contribution is important and necessary to the group's outcome.

Materials:

Copies of the lower portion of this page, one per group

Instructions:

Divide participants into groups, with the same number of people in each group. Distribute one handout to each group. After 10 minutes, ask groups to tally their points.

Comments: It was the combined contributions of simple items that achieved each group's final score. Each person's contribution was important and necessary to the group's outcome.

Instructions for Participants: Your group can acquire points ONLY from the items on people in your group. (You cannot leave your place to find items.)

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OPENING ACTIVITY: Buyers and Sellers

By simulating a buyer, and farmers trying to sell their beans, participants learn that both parties can benefit by working together.

Materials:

Copies of the activity portion below, beads in four colors (red, blue, green, yellow)—enough for each student to have a total of six beads—play money (\$1 bills)

Instructions:

- Assign participants to one of the four groups listed below and instruct them to sit with their group.
- Distribute beads and candies to the vendor groups, and tell them that they must pick six beads of any color combination.
- Give each participant a square from the sheet below (corresponding to his or her group).
- Give each member of the buyer group \$40 in fake money.
- Explain to the vendor groups that they all must make \$20.
- Tell participants that they are going to buy and sell their beads, but they must follow the instructions on their square. Give students 5–10 minutes to do the activity.



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BUYER GROUP

You get \$40. You must buy 10 items to feed your family.

Which products are you buying? (What color bead?)

VENDOR GROUP A

You must make \$20 to feed your family.

In this village, one person decides how much each product costs and how you will sell it. The prices they decided upon are below:

blue beads are \$10 each green beads are \$10 each red beads are \$5 each yellow beads are \$1 each

VENDOR GROUP B

You must make \$20 to feed your family.


In this village, everyone sells their beads at the price they want. Decide on a price for each color bead that you have.

VENDOR GROUP C

You must make \$20 to feed your family.

In this village, you have all joined together to set a fair price for each bead and you split the money at the end of the day. The prices you have decided upon are below:

red beads are \$8 each blue beads are \$6 each green beads are \$4 each yellow beads are \$2 each



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CLOSING PRAYER: All of Us Can Do Something

Leader: Inspired by human stories of faith and triumph, we gather in prayer. Reader 7: Our hearts can open to truly care about what happens to others who seem

different from us.
